## Active and passive voice

#### The active voice

When the subject of a sentence is the doer or actor, the Verb is in the Active Voice. It is so because the subject is active.

## **Example**

The dog chased the cat

## The passive voice


When the subject of a sentence is acted upon, the verb is in Active Voice. It is so because the subject is passive.

#### Example

The cat was chased by the dog

# Moving from the active to the passive voice

- The object of the verb in the Active Voice becomes the subject of the verb in the passive voice.
- The subject of the verb in the Active voice becomes the object in the passive voice. (Generally preceded by the preposition "by")
- The main verb is changed into the Past Participle form and it is preceded by the correct form of the verb "to be" in passive voice.



## Verb tenses in the passive voice

Present simple	am, is, are + made
Present progressive	am, is, are + being + sent
Past simple	was, were + invited

Past progressive	was, were + being + washed
Future (will)	will be + signed
Future (going to)	am, is, are + going to be + built
Present perfect	has, have + been + sold
Past perfect	had + been + hired
Future perfect	will + have been + finished
Modals: can/could	can, could + be + issued
Modal: have to	have to, has to, had to + be + arranged
Modal: must	must + be + stopped
